A regular meeting of the Wickliffe Environmental Commission was called to order at 7:02 P.M. at City Hall.

V Old Business

A Deer Chairman Mlachak reported that according to an article in the News Herald (2.27.09), a record setting deer season was set this past year. There were 252,017 deer taken down; 80% of hunters reported one kill, 16% reported two, 3% reported 3, .34% reported 4, and .17% reported 5 or more. Councilperson Koski provided two memos regarding deer recommendations. A deer survey would cost about \$5,700. She stated that the *Environmental Committee's* recommendation was to monitor the situation and not take any action. The Environmental Commission has a brief deer survey in the Wickliffe Connection. We hope receive some replies by our next meeting.

B Mail and other Correspondence Councilperson Koski informed that the City baited sewers on the north end for rats. Willowick did the same and the Health Department said the problem seems to be resolved now. Yard waste program has started and Metro Disposal has taken over the recyclables and will be upgrading the containers. Allied Waste and Republic Waste have merged. They will continue trash collection in Wickliffe.
