Dear City of Wickliffe Resident:

Please take time to read this information carefully, as it may answer many of the questions you may have regarding how to participate in this automated rubbish, yard waste, and recycling collection program. Each residence will be invoiced for weekly unlimited curbside rubbish, yard waste, and recycling collection services. Instructions on how to make payment will be enclosed with the invoice you will receive.

Bag-only service for solid waste collection is available, using 30-gallon Kimble-labeled bags purchased from Kimble Recycling & Disposal. Call Kimble Customer Service to purchase rolls of bags. *Note:* Each residence selecting bag service will be invoiced for weekly curbside yard waste and recycling collection services. Only solid waste in 30-gallon Kimble bags purchased from Kimble will be collected.

65-gallon recycling cart – The bright green, heavy-duty cart includes information on the lid regarding what can be recycled, provides a convenient way for residents to recycle large quantities, and are animal resistant. The recycling cart also enables collection by an automated truck, which enhances safety, eliminates the need to set recyclable materials out exposed, and eliminates the blowing and scattering of recyclable materials. **NOTE:** Please do not use your recycling cart for extra rubbish. Recycling carts containing rubbish will not be emptied and will be tagged to notify the resident of improper use.

Recyclables are collected every week. Simply place your recyclable materials into the recycling cart. On collection day, pull your recyclable materials, yard waste and rubbish carts within two to three feet of the street with the lid openings facing the street. The carts should be at least three feet from one another and other objects such as parked cars, mail boxes, trees, or bulky trash items. Though recycling service is provided every week, it is only necessary to place your recycling cart to the curb when it is full.

Single-stream recycling - There is not a need to bundle your newspapers, cardboard, or any other materials separately. All recyclable materials can be placed together in your recycling cart as a “single stream” of recyclable material. The individual components of the mixed recyclable materials or “single stream” will be segregated and prepared for market at Kimble’s recycling facility. See the attached list of all the items which can be placed in your recycling cart to be recovered and returned to markets.

65-gallon yard waste cart – The dark green cart includes information on the lid regarding what can be recycled, provides a convenient way for residents to recycle large quantities of yard waste, has attached lids, and is animal resistant. The yard waste cart also enables collection by an automated truck, which enhances safety, eliminates the need to set yard waste out exposed, and eliminates the blowing and scattering of yard waste materials. **NOTE:** Please do not use your yard waste cart for extra rubbish. Yard waste carts containing rubbish will not be emptied and will be tagged to notify the resident of improper use. Yard waste collection is every week March through January (Not in February).

Simply place your loose yard waste materials into the yard waste cart. On your collection day, pull your recyclable materials, yard waste and rubbish carts within two to three feet of the street with the lid openings facing the street. The carts should be at least three feet from one another and other objects such as parked cars, mail boxes, trees, or bulky trash items. Though recycling service is provided every week, it is only necessary to place your yard waste cart to the curb when it is full.

Collection of yard waste shall be weekly from March 1 through the second full week in December and on the same day as regular trash collection. Guidelines for setting out yard waste include:

- 1) Use of approved 65-gallon dark green carts supplied by Kimble.
- 2) Excess yard waste material may be placed in biodegradable 50-lb. Kraft paper yard waste bags or your current yellow containers.
- 3) Bundled yard waste is accepted not exceeding four feet in length, tied with cotton cord and weight not exceeding thirty pounds.

95-gallon rubbish cart – Each resident is to use the 95-gallon rubbish cart. Bulky items, including stoves, hot water tanks (water removed), washers, dryers, furniture, chairs, and carpet (four feet in length) are collected on your regular rubbish collection day. Please keep these large items three feet away from your carts. On the occasion you cannot fit all household rubbish in your cart, please place excess rubbish in separate containers or rubbish bags for collection on your regular collection day. Items not collected include automotive parts or construction materials generated by contractors performing work on homes.

Please remember to set all your residential rubbish, yard waste, and recyclable materials at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your collection day.

Kimble does not operate on the following Holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. If a Holiday falls on a weekday, service for that day and the rest of the week will be delayed by one day. If a holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, your collection day will not be delayed (collection day will remain the same).

A resident may request a vacation hold on service for up to a 90-day period if their residence is not occupied.

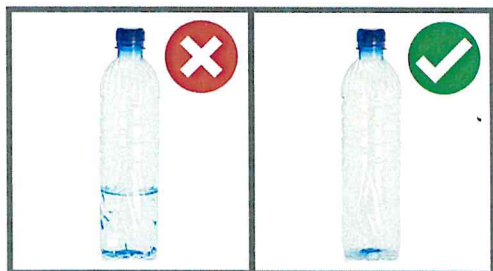


RECYCLING RIGHT - In 3 Easy Steps...



1 When in doubt... THROW IT OUT!

Make sure that all items are on the Kimble Recycling Center's approved list of accepted recyclables. If the item is not on the list or if you are unsure, place it directly into the trash.



2 Recyclables must be clean and dry.

Food and liquid are contaminants. No dirty jars or bottles with water still in them. Cardboard must also be clean and dry. Greasy pizza boxes are not recyclable.



3 No need to sort or bag your items.

Place your approved recyclables in your Kimble Recycling Cart all together. Items should be loose and unbagged. Plastic bags one of the largest contaminants at our Recycling Center.

PAPER & NEWSPAPER

Paper should be clean and dry. Please no glossy paper or foil wrapping paper. Paper should not be stained by waste. Magazines, mail, newspapers and copier paper are accepted.

CARDBOARD

Cardboard must be clean and dry. It should be flattened and be emptied of any packing materials. No food contamination such as grease on pizza boxes.

METAL AND ALUMINUM CANS

Only metal or aluminum food and drink cans are accepted. They should be empty, clean and dry before being placed loosely in the recycling cart. No other metal items are accepted.

GLASS BOTTLES

All glass bottles should be empty, clean and dry before being placed loosely in the recycling cart. Please no glassware, mirrors, window panes or light bulbs.

PLASTICS JUGS & BOTTLES

Only clean and empty plastic bottles and jugs are accepted. Please do not crush the bottles and keep lids on. No other plastic items are accepted - even if they have a recycle logo.

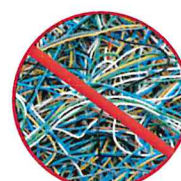

Residential Summer Sprinkling Program

The City of Wickliffe offers a program for eligible homeowners, which could reduce the sewer charges incurred during the months of May through September each year. With the Residential Summer Sprinkling Program, your summer water bill will reflect prorated sewer charges based on the average water consumption during the winter. This program applies to sewer charges only. *You will still be charged for all the water used.*

Residents who own and occupy a residential home within the City of Wickliffe are eligible to register. A one-time administrative fee of \$20.00 must be submitted with the completed form below, which must be submitted by April 30 to qualify. *Once you are enrolled, you do not need to send in another application or registration fee.*

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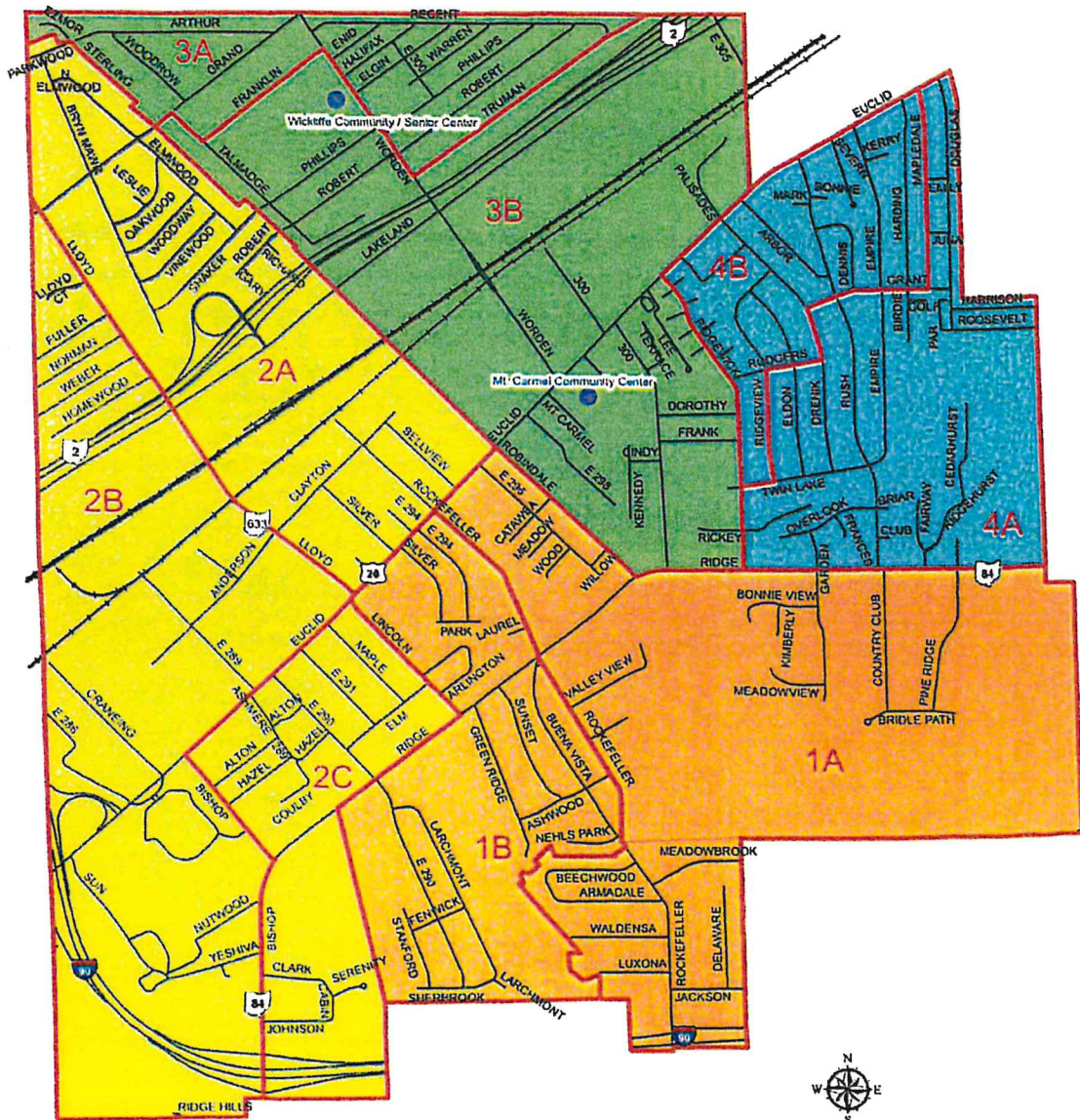

Voter Registration and Information Update Form

Please read instructions carefully. Please type or print clearly with blue or black ink.
For further information, you may consult the Secretary of State's website at: VoteOhio.gov or call (877) 767-6446.

Eligibility

You are qualified to register to vote in Ohio if you meet all the following requirements:

1. You are a citizen of the United States.
2. You will be at least 18 years old on or before the day of the general election.
3. You will be a resident of Ohio for at least 30 days immediately before the election in which you want to vote.
4. You are not incarcerated (in jail or in prison) for a felony conviction.
5. You have not been declared incompetent for voting purposes by a probate court.
6. You have not been permanently disenfranchised for violations of election laws.

Use this form to register to vote or to update your current Ohio registration if you have changed your address or name.

NOTICE: This form must be received or postmarked by the 30th day before an election at which you intend to vote. You will be notified by your county board of elections of the location where you vote. If you do not receive a notice following timely submission of this form, please contact your county board of elections.

Numbers 1 and 2 below are required by law. You must answer both of the questions for your registration to be processed.

Registering in Person

If you have a current valid Ohio driver's license, you must provide that number on line 10. If you do not have an Ohio driver's license, you must provide the last four digits of your Social Security number on line 10. If you have neither, please write "None."

Please see information on back of this form to learn how to obtain an absentee ballot.

Registering by Mail

If you register by mail and do not provide either an Ohio driver's license number or the last four digits of your Social Security number, you must enclose with your application a copy of one of the following forms of identification:

Current and valid photo identification, a military identification, or a current (within the last 12 months) utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or government document (other than a notice of voter registration mailed by a board of elections) that shows the voter's name and current address.

Residency Requirements

Your voting residence is the location that you consider to be a permanent, not a temporary, residence. Your voting residence is the place in which your habitation is fixed and to which, whenever you are absent, you intend to return. If you do not have a fixed place of habitation, but you are a consistent or regular inhabitant of a shelter or other location to which you intend to return, you may use that shelter or other location as your residence for purposes of registering to vote. If you have questions about your specific residency circumstances, you may contact your local board of elections for further information.

HOW TO OBTAIN AN OHIO ABSENTEE BALLOT

You are entitled to vote by absentee ballot in Ohio without providing a reason. Absentee ballot applications may be obtained from your county board of elections or from the Secretary of State at: VoteOhio.gov or by calling (877) 767-6446.

OHIO VOTER IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Voters must bring identification to the polls in order to verify identity. Identification may include current and valid photo identification, a military identification, or a copy of a current (within the last 12 months) utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document (other than a notice of voter registration mailed by a board of elections) that shows the voter's name and current address. Voters who do not provide one of these documents will still be able to vote by providing the last four digits of the voter's Social Security number and by casting a provisional ballot pursuant to R.C. 3505.181.
